

Individual Application for International Students

- 1. Search for Application Requirements and Admission Quotas of NTU departments
- 2. Fill out the online application form
- 3. Upload all required documents
- 4. Fill in the information regarding your referees (if required by the department)
- 5. Confirm and submit your application



Recommendation by High Schools for Overseas Chinese Students

- 1. This application is only through the recommendation by high school principals or teachers. Any individual application is not accepted.
- 2. Contact your high school to recommend you. Once you were recommended, you will receive an email with your account and password to log into the application system.
- 3. Fill out the online application form.
- 4. Select the departments you want to apply for.
- 5. Upload all the required documents and submit your application

*This application system includes NTU, NTNU and NTUST.
